

Monday night, catch the shuttle to downtown Denton for dinner on your own and exploring the **Denton square**.





#### **2023 Conference Keynote Speaker**



Dumpster diving, panhandling, and drinking were once everyday activities for **Frederick Shegog**. Despite a decade of alcohol abuse and time spent homeless, Shegog transformed himself. First, he was a successful college graduate, now a public speaker passionate about sharing his **transformational journey** to recovery.

Frederick has presented keynote addresses to educational conferences, colleges, and other venues nationwide, including Achieving the Dream (ATD) and The National Institute for Staff Organizational Development (NISOD).

Frederick is a member of multiple boards that support various community outreach initiatives, including the **Student's Recovery Board**, which provides online recovery support grounded in equity and justice, and the Board of BHI, which focuses on substance use disorders and related mental health conditions in teens. Frederick also consults with the **Clara Brown Entrepreneurial Academy** in Aurora, Colorado, promoting an entrepreneurial mindset for young minds.

His participation at various press conferences with Governor Tom Wolfe of Pennsylvania contributed to passing the **Pennsylvania Hunger Free Campus Bill**. An exposé on Frederick's life was published in the March 2022 edition of the Chronicle of Higher Education, titled "**The Redemption of Frederick Shegog**," and received the Education Writers Award for a feature story.

He was voted a **Philadelphia Region's Black Men Icon of 2020.** A documentary of his life story is forthcoming. Frederick is a proud graduate of Delaware County Community College and served as the commencement speaker at West Chester University, where he graduated summa cum laude.



# Building Engagement for Implementing & Sustaining Your SEM Plan

Sunday, October 29th 1:00 p.m.—4:00 p.m. Equestrian Ballroom—Arabian \$50.00 The **2023 SEM workshop** will cover approaches for keeping institutional leadership engaged with Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) as a campus-wide enterprise tool while operationally applying lessons learned to iteratively adjust SEM strategies and tactics to respond to enrollment pressures.

Participants will explore how to manage initiative fatigue by using a concept called LinkEX to *link* and *integrate* multiple initiatives with SEM to *extend* benefit for the institution. Drawing on actual case studies the workshop will include how to build engagement and support for effective SEM plan implementation; how to keep institutional leadership engaged in SEM; how to apply operational lessons learned to adjust SEM tactics on the fly; and how to create effective SEM implementation teams as a proactive response for enrollment health and student success.

Regardless if you have a SEM plan or not, participants will learn implementing and sustaining lessons applica-

ble to any planning. This will be an interactive session with the opportunity for participants to engage with the presenter and each other to share experiences and explore solutions to challenges and opportunities they are encountering.

The National Student Clearinghouse's (NSC) free enrollment and degree reporting allows institutions to offload the burden of enrollment and degree reporting to the NSC. The process provides status information on student financial aid recipients to the education finance industry and the Department of Education's National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS).

The National Student Clearinghouse provides this service to postsecondary institutions in the United States. This workshop is designed for all levels of enrollment reporters at your institution.

Whether you are new to reporting, have inherited reporting recently or have a good working knowledge of reporting the National Student Clearinghouse will be available to meet you at your level.

If you are new to the Clearinghouse or inherited reporting recently, **Andi Liner, Regional Relationship Manager**, Texas will walk you through the Clearinghouse's Enrollment Reporting service, the NSLDS' status requirements, and how enrollment data moves between your institution and the NSLDS, lenders, quarantors, and servicers.

Tina Damico, Senior Specialist, Data Excellence & Operations will be available to help reporters who are novices or experts with their burning questions or help through enrollment reporting scenarios. Many institutions in Texas have worked with Tina and tapped in to her expertise.

Regardless of where you are, **Tina and Andiwill be available to help**. We encourage institutions to come with questions and the National Student Clearinghouse will be ready to respond.
