Summer is in full swing, and things are heating up both outside and in higher education.

If you haven't perused the re-vamped <u>TCCNS.org</u> website, you are missing out. The website is an excellent resource for our peer institutions, the THECB, our students and their families. In fact, several new enhancements have recently been rolled out on the site. A new field was added where institutions can indicate if a course satisfies the Component Area Option (CAO) requirement. This field can be selected if a course satisfies both a Foundational Core Area (FCA) and the CAO 090 requirement or if it fulfills on the CAO 090 requirement. This addition provides better clarity regarding how courses are fulfilling core components.

Another update seeks to provide greater transparency into how courses transfer from one institution to another. Each institution will indicate how courses are mapped to their institution in relation to the TCCNS course. The first option is 'Course as taught by Institution'. If your institution offers a course that is directly equivalent to the TCCNS course in terms of content and credit hours, this would be your selection. However, if your institution does not offer the specific course as described by the TCCNS, either because you don't offer the course or because it is delivered in a different format, you would select the 'Articulation Placeholder' option. You can read more details about these enhancements here.

The 2025-2026 TCCNS data is live **now** as are these enhancements. Make sure your school has rolled over their courses. If you aren't certain who your school contacts are you can go to https://tccns.org/contacts/ and select your school. If you have any access issues or questions, please email tccns@tacrao.org.

The newly minted Enrollment Reporting Committee has been busy as well. Make sure to visit their new resource page on the <u>TACRAO website</u>. They are working diligently to put together documentation and resources for the benefit of the whole membership. Check back often as they continue to add new content. You must login with your TACRAO credentials to view the site. Once logged in, click on the Resources tab and select Enrollment Reporting.

Don't forget between those Saturday afternoons by the pool and squeezing in those last few days of vacation before the Fall rush to register for our Annual Conference in El Paso this November. Georgina, Cassandra and the rest of the LAC are hard at work to provide us a unique and memorable conference.


