



On March 30<sup>th</sup>-April 2<sup>nd</sup> 2025, AACRAO will hold its 110<sup>th</sup> annual meeting in Seattle, Washington.

As with previous years, we know that many TACRAO members will make the trek to Seattle to join the nation's best to learn from other professionals and to offer up their own expertise in registrar, admissions, and other related areas.

While we may be a bit biased, we know that Texas holds a lot of knowledge and insight that is hugely beneficial to our non-Texas colleagues. As a result, the TACRAO Executive Committee (TEC) meets each year and selects a session(s) that highlights the extraordinary work we're doing in Texas and recognizes the quality of the TACRAO member presentations we receive each year. Following each TACRAO conference, the TEC reviews evaluations and nominates one (or in the case of a tie, a few) TACRAO sessions for the AACRAO Best of the Best scholarship. If AACRAO selects that session for that year's agenda, these individuals are able to use their scholarship to attend the upcoming AACRAO conference.

## **2025 AACRAO Scholarship Nominating Criteria**

The session evaluations and comments provided by our TACRAO session attendees truly do matter. We actually do read all of your comments, recommendations, and accolades!

This past TACRAO conference hosted over 100 sessions, we had a collective 800+ session evaluations submitted, and the average presenter rating was a 4.5 (on a 1-5 scale) so choosing which session(s) to recommend for a scholarship was a difficult and competitive process.

For this year's evaluation criteria, the evaluation criteria came exclusively from the surveys. The list was sorted to focus on TACRAO member presenters (i.e. the sessions presented by members of our colleges, universities, or district system offices). Next, the "Would you recommend this session?" information was sorted (along with the other evaluation fields) and this information and the comments were provided to the TEC.

The TEC then looked at the sessions which had over 10 submitted evaluations and then reviewed those sessions with the highest overall ratings to make a recommendation.

Once the recommendation is made, the potential winners are contacted and then asked if they would be willing to present, if selected, at AACRAO. Once the presenters agree that they would present, the nomination to AACRAO is then made.

## **2025 AACRAO Scholarship Winner(s)**

We had two sessions where the same number of attendees submitted a review for two sessions and both sets of attendees also gave both sessions a perfect "5" rating.

**November 24, 1957—January 23, 2025**


