reetings from Houston! It's been a busy last few months with TACRAO's technology. We appreciate your patience and support as we work out the kinks and quirks of the new membership system (MemberClicks). If you have any trouble, please feel free to email me, and I'd be glad to take a look.

The biggest feature we implemented recently was a TACRAO Job Board, which allows TACRAO members to find that next admissions or records position in their career trajectory or post open positions for free (just be sure to log in first!) if they are looking for that perfect candidate to join their team. Since its launch in late June, we've had almost 90 jobs posted and over 14,000 views of job postings! Fun fact: it reaches outside of Texas, and people from Iowa, Wyoming, Washington, and Virginia seem to really be interested in searching for jobs with our member institutions-together, they account for almost 15% of our traffic to the Job Board.

If you are looking for next step in your career, you can sign up for alerts every time any position is posted. You may do this on the right-hand side of the home page of the TACRAO Job Board. If you are interested in posting a position, we've provided step by step instructions found <u>here</u>. When checking out, be sure to select the "Job Distribution" upgrade to send an announcement to all the

TACRAO membership. Just be sure to use discount code EMAIL to remove the one cent charge and send it for free rather than posting to the listserv.

The listserv will be the next major item we intend to work on. Right now, the TACRAO listserv is hosted by a member institution, and we are exploring how to move that listserv from that institution to MemberClicks. This would take the burden of maintaining the listserv off of the member institution and the individual member who is the admin and transfer that responsibility to the TACRAO Executive Committee (TEC). This transfer would also allow us to maintain more than one listserv. For example, we plan to have a listserv for the general membership, as we do now, and we also plan to have one for High School Relations and the College Day/ Night Program to specifically group that communication and prevent you from getting those messages if you don't want them. My goal is to have a plan to transfer by the end of the month and hopefully get us to the new listserv before the annual conference.

Speaking of the annual conference, be sure to register if you haven't already done so! The TEC toured the location for the Tuesday Night Big Event, and it was one of the most unique and unexpected places I've ever been. The LAC has done a wonderful job in preparing for us to come in November, and we would love to see you there!

Membership Dues

As a reminder, if you've not yet paid your 2021-2022 membership dues, these fees are due 8/31/21. Your institution will need to be up-to-date on your dues payments to access the College Day/Night schedule, maintain membership voting rights, and to keep all of your other TACRAO membership perks.

Your key contact should have already received the institutional invoice. You can view your key contact by visiting our member directory search.

Texas Common Course Numbering System (TCCNS) Invoice

The TCCNS invoice is separate from the membership dues, but goes toward the support of the TCCNS site, TCCNS meetings, and other associated activities that support seamless Texas transfer.

Due to the challenges brought about by COVID-19, the lack of travel that occurred in the 2020-2021 year, and the change to our new TACRAO membership system, TACRAO will not issue a TCCNS invoice for the 2020-2021 year. We will, however, resume TCCNS invoicing this upcoming 2021-2022 year.


